SUMMER SCHOOL 2024

JUNE 4 - JUNE 28, 2024 (NO CLASSES ON WEDNESDAY JUNE 19TH) 8:00 AM - 3:00 PM

The BMC Summer School Program allows enrolled students the opportunity to get ahead in course work. Taking a summer school course provides students the option to enroll in more courses during the school year.

The summer session is fast-paced. In addition to the 7 hours of instruction received each day, it will be important for each student to allocate additional time after school to work on homework, should it be required.

COURSE OFFERINGS THIS SUMMER

Only 1 credit H.O.P.E. class available. No 1/2 credit course offered.

H.O.P.E - PHYSICAL EDUCATION/1 CREDIT COURSE

COST \$900

Students will attend HOPE Class Monday thru Thursday from 8:00am to 3:00pm, and Friday Virtually.

This course is designed to help students develop and enhance healthy behaviors that influence lifestyle choices and student health and fitness. Course content includes physical education content as well as health education topics.

- Registrations for each course/session will close as soon as the maximum number of students per session is reached.
- H.O.P.E. is a one credit course.
- Summer school is rigorous and fast paced; therefore, student placement is carefully reviewed.
- Students enrolled in H.O.P.E. must be able to engage in indoor and outdoor physical activity. The course includes physical activity.
- Students who do not attend each day of the session as required, will not earn credit for the course.

GEOMETRY HONORS

COST \$900

Prerequisite: Passing of Algebra 1 Honors or Algebra 2 (H-9) with an "A" or above each semester and an HSPT Math Score in the 90% percentile or higher or a 550 or higher on the PSAT.

This course gives a rigorous, in-depth study of geometry with emphasis on the geometric proof. Topics include the study of Euclidean geometry of lines, planes, angles, triangles, similarity, congruence, geometric inequalities, polygons, circles, area, volume, and right triangle trigonometry. A TI-84+ CE graphing calculator is required for this course.

SUMMER SCHOOL FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Who may attend the BMC Summer School Program?

Only students who are fully enrolled for the 2024/2025 BMC school year are granted admission to Summer School at BMC.

2. Whom do I speak with to be sure taking a Summer School course will benefit me?

Current BMC students should contact their assigned school counselor.

3. Are students required to have an iPad?

Yes, all students enrolled in any course will need an iPad for Summer School.

4. When will grades be available?

Report cards for first semester will be sent out on June 14th, and report cards for second semester will be ready on June 28th.

5. What is the attendance policy?

Due to the short nature of the summer session, students are required to follow all attendance policies. Students are permitted one absence per two weeks. More than two absences will result in the student being dropped from the course with no earned credit. Students are not allowed to be absent on Friday, June 14th and Friday, June 28th as the semester exam is administered on those days. If a student is absent on these days this will result in not earning credit for the course.

Students are only allowed 2 tardies per two weeks, with the third tardy resulting in an absence. Any tardy thereafter will result in dismissal of the course, thereby forfeiting credit and resulting in a final grade on the transcript and/or "W". If a student is dismissed from BMC Summer School, tuition will not be refunded.

If a student is absent:

If an absence occurs, parents are required to call the attendance office at (407) 293-7561 ext. 292 by 8am on the date of the absence. Travel and appointments are unexcused absences for summer school courses. **If travel dates and extra-curricular opportunities cannot be changed to accommodate required class attendance, the student is advised not to sign up for summer school.** A final exam will be taken on the last day of the semester session (2 weeks) on June 14th and Friday, June 28th. No accommodations will be made for students unable to take the final at its scheduled time.

If a student arrives late:

All students arriving late must report to the attendance office at (407) 293-7561 ext. 292 on the day the student is arriving late or prior to the date if possible. Students are allowed two tardies per two weeks. The third tardy will result in an absence with any tardy or absence thereafter resulting in dismissal from summer school. Students that arrive more than 40 minutes late will receive an absence.

If a student must leave early:

Students that leave more than 40 minutes early will receive an absence and any absence thereafter will result in dismissal of the program. Early departures within the 40 minute allowance, will result in a tardy. Two early departures, or any combination of tardies and departures exceeding two will result in an absence. Any early departure, tardy, or absence thereafter will result in dismissal of the program.

Parents/guardians are required to call the attendance office at (407) 27561 ext. 292. Early dismissal is generally not allowed and will only be considered in extenuating circumstances. Administration reserves the right to withdraw a student from his/her course for leaving early.

6. What are the lunch options for students?

Aramark provides students a reasonable selection of items for lunch or students may pack a lunch. Microwaves are not available. Students are not allowed to leave campus for lunch. For the daily convenience of purchasing lunch, accounts must be setup by visiting www.myschoolbucks.com.

7. What is the cancellation/refund policy?

Cancellations made by Wednesday, May 15, 2024 will be subject to a \$300 withholding fee. **THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS AFTER THIS DATE.** Cancellation requests must be emailed to cooperd@bishopmoore.org.

8. Where do I register for Summer School?

A link to the registration for the Summer School Program will be emailed to each student that is admitted and fully registered for the 2024-2025 school year.

HEALTH ISSUES

- Students may not carry medications at any time while on campus without the proper authorization.
