- Primary responsibility of school counseling is the care of support of the student
 - Academic planning/goal setting
 - Scheduled meetings and check-ins
 - Course selection
 - Could v. Should
 - Help the student navigate any and all concerns
 - Find out who you are and who you are not

- Class grades consist of
 - Formative Assessment
 - Summative Assessment
- 2 Quarters per semester
 - Progress Report- mid quarter
 - Report card each quarter
- 2 Semester per year
- Only semester grades are reported on transcript and GPA calculation.

GRADING

Scholastic grades are recorded in letters. The grade scale follows:

A = 90-100 - Exceptional accomplishment

8 = 80-89 - High accomplishment

C = 70-79 - Average accomplishment D = 60-69 - Low accomplishment

D = 60-69 ~ Low accomplish F = 0.59 ~ Failing

I = Incomplete
