DIGITAL **ART** AND CREATIVE PHOTOGRAPHY

CREATIVE PHOTOGRAPHY 1 & 2

An introductory experience in digital photography. Students will have the opportunity to learn the many facets of photography, such as the foundations of composition, techniques of professional photographers, and an introduction to Photoshop. Projects include but are not limited to alternate angles, geometry focusing on line and shape, portraiture, documentary, products, landscapes, and learning the difference between color and black & white photography.



Students will learn to color balance each image, convert images to black and white, and learn how to utilize spot color in Photoshop. Students use their iPads for their projects but are encouraged to use cameras if they have access to one. Students will display their best images in the annual art show and end the semester with a review of their portfolio.



DIGITAL ART 1 & 2

Designed to teach students how to use multimedia processes and techniques. Students will learn the many facets of Photoshop and how to produce works related to graphic design. Projects include print advertisements, magazine covers, typography, poster design, and paintings in PhotoShop. Students will use their iPads as well as other industry software to complete assignments. Students should have adequate computer knowledge for this course. Students will display their best images in the annual art show and end the semester with a review of their portfolio.

SCULPTURE

Students explore and create 3-dimensional artworks including functional and non-functional pieces made from clay, cardboard, wire, found objects and more. Students in the sculpture studio focus on creativity, techniques, processes, and materials to create sculptural works of art inspired by personal experiences and interests. Sculpture students create clay sculptures and vessels, architectural inspired buildings and houses in cardboard, metal reliefs, and other artworks using papier mache', Wire and plaster to practice modeling, carving, casting, and assemblage processes, and techniques.



2 DIMENSIONAL 1 - 3 H PORTFOLIO DEVELOPMENT HONORS 2D AND 3D AP STUDIO ART.

Bishop Moore Catholic provides students the opportunity to explore the full breadth of 2 Dimensional arts starting with 2D Design 1 to Portfolio Development and AP Studio Art and Design. Students will start off learning basic materials, methods and techniques in a variety of collage, painting and drawing materials and with each year more advanced materials and methods are added.



CERAMICS (POTTERY) 1, 2 & 3H

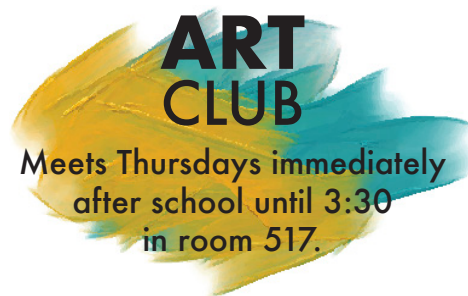
Students develop skills with traditional hand-building ceramic clay methods in ceramic studies and keep a sketchbook of their designs.

The emphasis is on well-crafted functional forms. Students will learn to master hand building techniques used throughout history to create functional yet artistic clay forms.
