### Emergency Personnel

Certified athletic trainer(s), Team Physician, medical residents, athletic training student(s), head coach, or assistant coach(es), security.

### Emergency Communication

The primary form of communication in contacting EMS personnel will be the use of a **cell phone**. The athletic trainers, coaches, staff and administrators, will have access to a cell phone at all times. The primary form of communication between the game administrators, athletic trainer, and athletic director during contests will be cell phones. Secondary communication would be landline telephones.

**Emergency Equipment** - First Aid kits may be provided to each team during practice and competitions. If ATC is present, they may use their discretion on what equipment to bring based on the demands of the sport. Additional supplies are located in the Dunn Family Athletic Trainer's Suite in the Moore Center. Portable AEDs may be present during athletic competitions.

### Emergency Action Protocol

1. The Certified Athletic Trainer (ATC) and/or team physician will assess scene safety, conduct primary evaluation/immediate care of the injured/ill victims
2. Activation of EAP as needed - ATC will directly identify coach or AD to call 911
3. ATC will provide appropriate emergency care until the arrival of EMS personnel and assist with emergency care as needed in conjunction with the team physician. The ATC will provide or assist in relaying necessary information:
  - a. name, address, telephone number of caller
  - b. number of victims; condition of victims
  - c. first-aid treatment initiated
  - d. specific directions as needed to locate scene
  - e. other information as requested by dispatcher
4. Athletic Director (AD) will communicate with Security to ensure and assist with:
  - a. Unlocking all necessary gates and clearing a path for emergency vehicle(s), Emergency route shown below
  - b. Meeting the ambulance and guiding the vehicle to the location
5. Head coach, assistant coaches, game administrator, and school resource officer/security are responsible for crowd control. Athletic Director may assist when Step 4 (above) is complete.
6. An assistant coach is to travel with the injured student athlete to the hospital if a parent and or guardian are not present.
7. Once EMS has transported the injured student athlete, the ATC will clean the scene.
8. Communication will occur with all incident stakeholders including but not limited to: AD (if not present), student athlete parents/guardian (if not present), school principal and school president (via AD), etc.
9. All potential stakeholders will debrief about critical incident
10. ATC will document all events.

**Note:** If ATC is not present, but on the premises **PLEASE DO NOT** move injured student-athlete(s) when unconscious or a head/spinal injury is suspected. Call ATC immediately.

**Lightning Safe Shelter** - Primary shelter will be the respective lockers rooms for both teams. Secondary shelter for the home team will be the weight room and the classrooms. Secondary shelter for the away team and spectators will be their vehicle
