The Office of Advancement is proud to oversee a growing number of named endowment funds that have been established to provide financial assistance to students who wish to attend Bishop Moore Catholic. Each year a defined portion of the fund is awarded while the principal investment is held "in perpetuity" so that the vision of the donors will continue to make a difference at BMC. These funds have been established by alumni, parents, and friends of our school.

Peter and Catherine McCaffrey Endowment Fund

This fund was established in memory of Peter and Catherine McCaffrey, parents of Anne Schultz. Joe and Anne Schultz wanted to establish a fund that would provide financial assistance for an incoming freshman student from St. James Cathedral School.

Fund Balance: \$20,000

Dawn Michelle Aberwald Endowment Fund

Dawn ('82) graduated Valedictorian of her class. Along with her focus on academics, she was involved in numerous clubs. After graduating college, Dawn was a loving and compassionate veterinarian for many years. Dawn and her family understood and appreciated the value of education and the time spent at Catholic school were the most influential in determining the values best demonstrated by Dawn. Gifts from this endowment will be granted in the following manner: 50% is awarded to the Valedictorian of BMC to cover ancillary expenses (books, room, board) and 50% to assist a current student from St. Andrews Catholic School in financial need.

Fund Balance: \$42,355

St. Michael the Archangel Endowment

This fund was established out of the idea that our BMC community could benefit from the presence of a religious sister, full-time on campus. The family who began this endowment did so because of the powerful impact religious sisters have had within their own faith journey. With this endowment, students are able to witness, on a daily basis, a religious sister who has said yes to God's call for her life. Our goal for this fund is to reach \$750,000, which would yield an investment to sustain the salary for a religious sister in perpetuity.

Fund Balance: \$121,341

Guardian Angel Endowment

This fund provides financial assistance to BMC student's families who are in crisis due to an unexpected emergency. The purpose of the fund is to lighten a family's financial burden when facing serious illness, loss of employment, or other factors that affect their ability to pay school-related expenses such as tuition, technology, books, uniforms, lunch accounts, sports teams, and other essentials.

Fund Balance: \$361,350

Ann Hefferin Memorial Endowment

Two memorial scholarships are awarded in loving memory of Ann Marie Hefferin, '11. Ann died suddenly in her freshman year of college at UCF. An annual scholarship of \$1,000 will be awarded to an incoming freshman from St. Charles Borromeo Catholic School or St. Margaret Mary Catholic School who is in financial need of assistance. The incoming freshman scholarship is awarded on behalf of the student's desire and commitment to their catholic education. The second \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a college-bound graduate of BMC. The graduating senior scholarship is based on academic achievement and an essay written by the applicant.

Fund Balance: \$33,755

Kelly Reen Memorial Endowment

Kelly Erin Reen was a graduate of St. Charles Borromeo Catholic School and a Sophomore at BMC at the time of her passing ('10). Kelly participated in basketball, soccer, and track while in school. Kelly loved her many friends, classmates, coaches, and teachers at St. Charles Borromeo Catholic School. Her warmth, energy and sense of humor were magnetic; she lit up any room she entered. Two memorial scholarships are awarded in her loving memory. These \$1,000 awards are granted each year: one to a graduating senior from BMC and the other to an incoming freshman from St. Charles Borromeo.

Fund Balance: \$25,860

Michael Scheve Memorial Endowment

Michael Lawrence Sheve ('98) played on the '94-'97 basketball and '94-'98 golf teams. Michael went on to attend the University of Florida for his undergraduate degree and Mercer School of Law where he earned his law degree. Known as "Scheve", he was a very kind person and had the ability to make everyone he met feel important. As an avid golfer, proceeds from the annual Hornet Scramble: Michael Scheve Memorial Golf Tournament support funding for his endowment and will continue to help with financial assistance for students in need at Bishop Moore Catholic High School and Morning Star Catholic School.

Fund Balance: \$132,157

Bishop Moore Endowment and Charitable Trust

The Endowment and Charitable Trust was established for the following purposes: capital improvements, faculty and staff salaries, faculty and staff professional development, and student financial aid.

Fund Balance: \$3,982,937
