Fifth Sunday of Lent



In the Gospel this Sunday, we read about the beautiful miracle of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. Before the miracle, however, **we also get to see the humanity of Jesus**: his loving friendships and his grief when someone he loves is suffering. Jesus wept at the news of his friend's death, and **we can be assured that he weeps with us in our suffering as well.**

This suffering, however, comes with hope. Just as Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, **he raised us up in our struggles too, transforming suffering into love.** Often we hear the phrase, "everything happens for a reason," which implies that God causes bad things to happen with a greater purpose. Instead, perhaps we could consider restating this to: "God can redeem everything that happens." Only in his great power can he bring light in the darkness, hope to the hopeless, and ultimately life over death.

God, in our suffering, give us faith to trust in the certainty of your mercy and redemption.
